COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

All of mainland Scotland will enter Tier 4 from Saturday, 26th December.

- Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire are currently at Tier 3, while Moray is in Tier 1.
- However, from Boxing Day all areas of mainland Scotland will enter Tier 4, and will remain at this level for at least three weeks.
- Plans to relax restrictions for a five-day period over Christmas have also been cancelled.
