# **GREC UPDATES**

# NRPF Project: Tackling & Preventing Destitution

Have you ever heard of NRPF? Most people have never heard this term, let alone understand it. It stands for 'No Recourse to Public Funds' and applies to non-UK nationals living in the UK.

In a nutshell our project aims to explain NRPF properly and work in partnership with many organisations in the Grampian region to mitigate the problems it can cause when they arise. We also run a lived experience group where people with first hand experience of NRPF can share their expertise on these problems. Let's give an example:

Most international students have NRPF status, which for students restricts work to 20 hours a week. Many will encounter no problem during their study, but some may find themselves in financial difficulty due to a sudden crisis and they will not be able to access benefits or Local Authority homelessness support system when things go wrong.

## Language Cafe & Drop In

Do you want to practice your English, make new friends, or get help and advice? If so, you should join us at our weekly Language Cafe & Drop In!

The Language Cafe & Drop In runs every Thursday between 11am and 3pm at Aberdeen Arts Centre, 33 King Street. Our Language & Integration team run activities to help you improve your English, while our Caseworkers can give advice and support on a range of equality related issues.

Our resident artists from North East Culture Collective will also be on hand to lead you in fun creative activities, and on the last Thursday of every month we run special Family Sessions suitable for all ages- so you can bring the kids along too!

Started in July 2022 and supported by the Fairer Aberdeen Fund, our NRPF project builds on the work done by the No Recourse North East (NRNE) partnership since 2014. NRNE brought together over 40 third and public sector organisations working with non-UK nationals subject to NRPF, and possibly facing destitution due to this.

NRPF can be a complex subject. There is a misconception that 'no recourse to public funds' means everything provided by public money, but this is not the case - there is a fixed list of certain 'public funds' for immigration purposes and beyond that, people may access some help.
