### **In-Trans Service**

For 17 years, GREC's interpreting and translation service, In-Trans, has supported ethnic minority communities in Grampian and beyond to access reliable interpreting and translating services.

At In-Trans, we take great pride in our ongoing development, consistently improving our services to meet the highest standards. This includes implementing external oral and written assessments in our recruitment process for community interpreters and continued professional development opportunities for fully qualified interpreters.

In-Trans currently works with over 120 skilled professionals fluent in 54 languages and provides these services to public, private, and third sector organisations.

**PATH Events** 

Our PATH (Prejudice & Solidarity Archived Through History) project is a community-led heritage project run in collaboration with our partners at Four Pillars.

PATH volunteers conduct research imto the history of Aberdeen's diverse communities. There are two exciting events this month featuring our PATH community researchers.



Moreover, we believe in giving service providers the tools they need to work effectively with interpreters, so we offer specialised training sessions.

As we look back on our journey, we stay committed to our main goal: creating meaningful connections and making sure everyone has fair access to information to make informed decisions. GREC's In-Trans service is not just about language; it's about building bridges among our community members.

### **Policy and Research**

Part of GREC's work is to carry out research to help inform policy, looking at issues in a systematic way, identifying what is happening, how it affects people and what needs to change. In December, we finished a short project about community involvement in research, funded by Research Data Scotland. In discussion groups we spoke with 40 people who have lived in Scotland between a few months and a few decades.

The top issue was making sure newcomers have access to accurate, useful information. Other topics discussed included employment, racism, culture shock, and issues around children and schooling.

There was also clear appetite for involvement in research and through lived experience groups. For the full report or a one-page summary, please visit the Policy and Research page of the GREC <u>website</u>.

In February 2024, we will start collaborating in a research project led by Migration Policy Scotland and looking at different experiences on effective interventions to reduce financial disadvantage for ethnic minority and immigrant communities. We will also be publishing our annual overview of hate crime reports in Grampian.




# **Community Updates**




### **Holocaust Memorial Day**

On Friday 26th January, **Aberdeen Holocaust Memorial Committee** hosted their annual Holocaust Memorial Day event at the Art Gallery. This year's theme was the 'fragility of freedom'.

ITutu's senior dance group offered an incredible performance. Northfield Academy and Harlaw Academy participated in the event sharing learnings from the "Lessons of Auschiwtz" programme and poems from Erika Schulhof Rybeck, who came to Aberdeen as part of the Kindertransport.

This event demonstrated the importance of involving young people in promoting equality and combatting antisemitism and other forms of prejudice.
