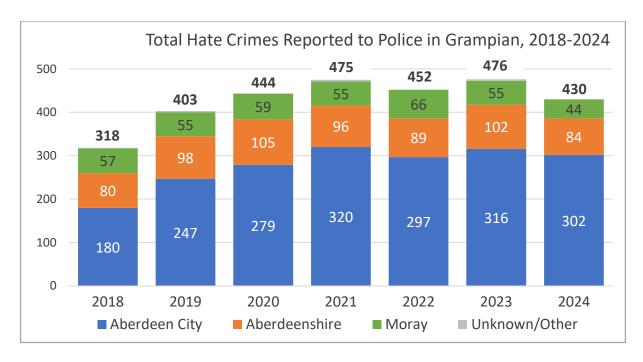


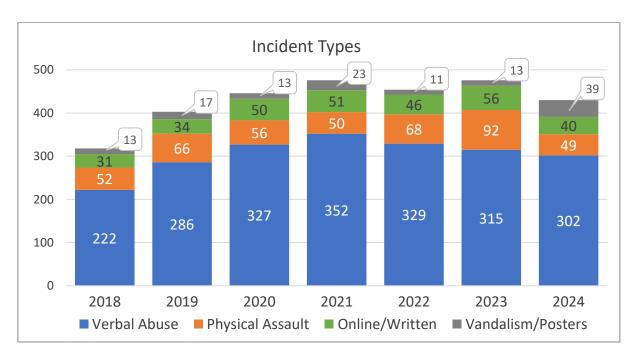
GREC Briefing Paper: Hate Crimes Reported in Grampian

Trends between 2018-2024

Since 2018, GREC has been collating data from Police Scotland on the hate crimes reported in Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire and Moray. This paper presents the data covering this period. Detailed data for each year is available on the GREC website: www.grec.co.uk/research. While we know that many hate crimes go unreported, it is still useful to be aware of those that are reported to police.



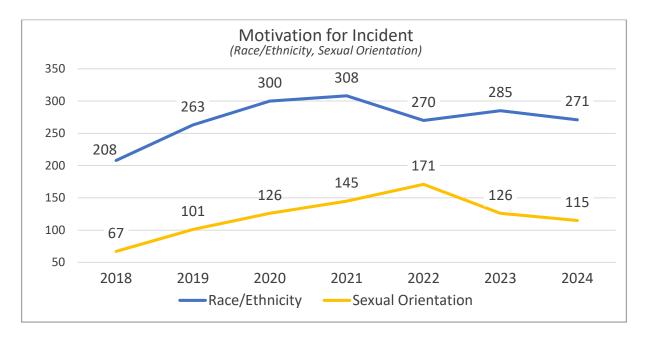
As shown above, the number of hate crimes reported to police each year has remained between 400-500 since 2019, with around $\frac{3}{2}$ reported in Aberdeen City. Some years have a few incidents recorded with an 'unknown' location, due to postcode typos, or 'other,' for example on a ship at sea. Details of geographic location are provided in the last section of this report.

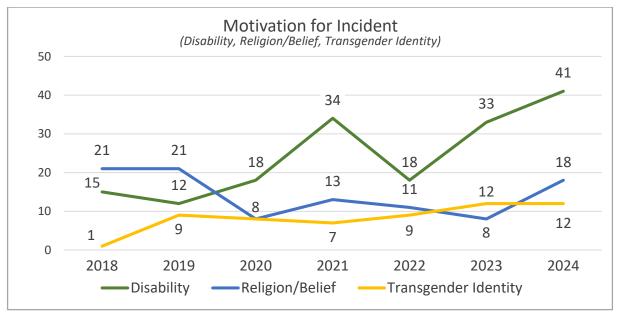




The most frequent type of incident was verbal abuse, accounting for around ¾ of reports each year. Between 10-20% of incidents were physical assault (often with an element of verbal abuse), 8-12% were online or written (including social media), and between 2-9% were hate-related vandalism, graffiti, or posters. Several trends are worth noting, especially between 2020-2023:

- During this period, there was an increase in both online incidents and total incidents reported.
- Following this period, the total number of reported incidents decreased in 2024, and the number of reported assaults fell to its lowest level since 2016 (49 and 46, respectively).
- 2024 also saw a significant number of hate-related graffiti and posters reported.





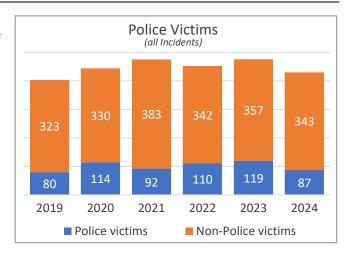
As shown above, the most frequent motivators for hate crime were racism and homophobia, accounting for around $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ of incidents each year, respectively. Disability, religion/belief and transgender identity motivated smaller numbers of incidents. In 2024, there was also one incident related to variation in sex characteristics (a category from new hate crime legislation).



Victim and Perpetrator Characteristics

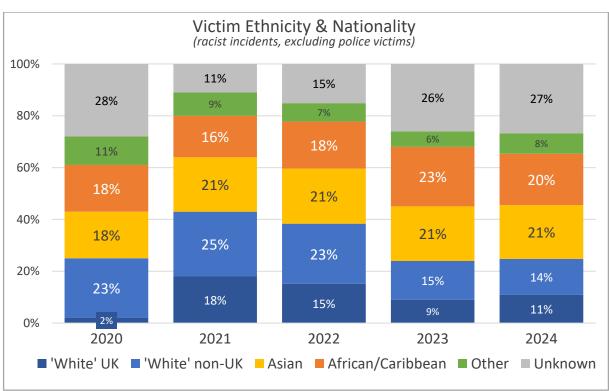
Police Victims

For between one-fifth and one-quarter of incidents each year, the victim was a police officer, prison guard or police staff. While abuse is always unacceptable, it is important to consider the power relationship between offenders and law enforcement. Ultimately, hate crime laws are designed to protect marginalised people. Therefore, sections below focus on incidents with non-police victims, where excluding them helps to clarify the overall picture.



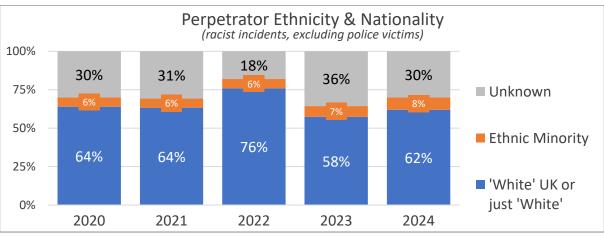
Ethnicity & Nationality¹

As shown below, most victims of racist hate crime were either 'white' non-UK nationals (e.g. Polish or Lithuanian), or racialised people from the UK or other countries (e.g. people of Asian, African or other ethnicity). There was also a small number of incidents (up to two per year) where victims were Scottish Gypsy/Travellers. Meanwhile, where recorded, nearly all perpetrators of racist hate crime were 'white' UK nationals, or only recorded as 'white.' The small number of ethnic minority perpetrators (less than 20 per year) tended to target other ethnic minorities. Details are provided in the appendix.



¹ In the chart above, 'other' includes Arab, South American, Mixed/Multiple and Gypsy/Traveller. Where victim ethnicity is 'unknown,' the data was not collected or the incident did not target a specific person (e.g. graffiti). In the charts below, 'ethnic minority' includes racialised people (any nationality), 'white' non-UK nationals, and Gypsy/Travellers. The number of individuals is greater than the number of incidents, as some incidents had multiple victims or perpetrators. For victim/perpetrator dynamics (below), calculations are based on the number of victims with recorded ethnicity/nationality.

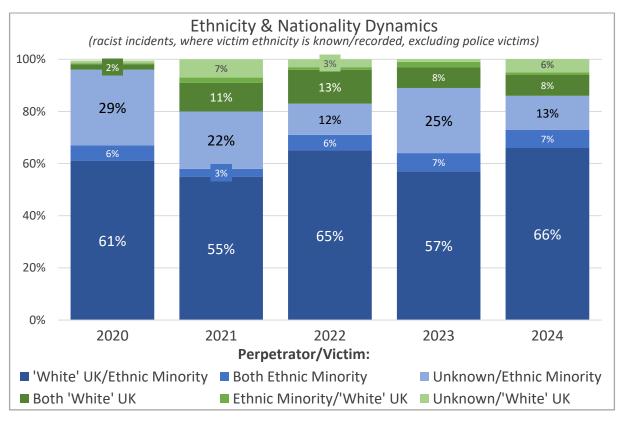




'White Scottish/British' Victims of Racism?

At first glance, it may seem surprising that 2-18% of racist incidents each year targeted 'White' UK nationals, including 2-13% where both victim and perpetrator were 'White Scottish' or 'White British.' However, there are several points to consider here:

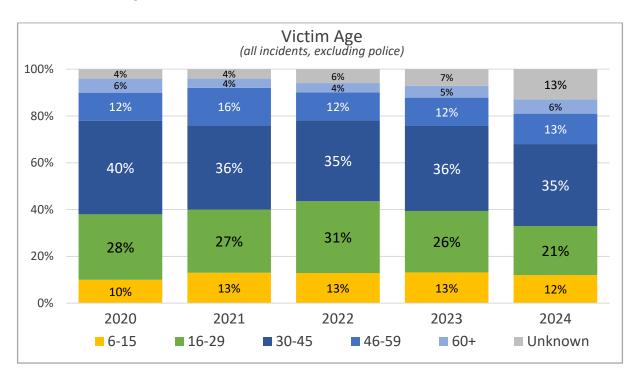
- When police respond to a conflict, a prejudice-related 'aggravation' is recorded if racist language is used (even between people in the same ethnic group). Without context, it is impossible to know how many incidents were part of other conflicts.
- In incidents with multiple victims, one person may be 'White British,' with racist abuse directed at their ethnic minority partner, child, friend or colleague.
- 'White Scottish/British' may include European ethnic minorities with UK citizenship, who are often still perceived as outsiders, or the UK-born children of European immigrants. In fact, there were several incidents each year which appear to be the latter (e.g. with two victims, a 'White British' child or teenager, and a European adult in their 30s or 40s).
- In the most serious racist incidents (assaults), less than 1% of victims were 'White Scottish/British.'

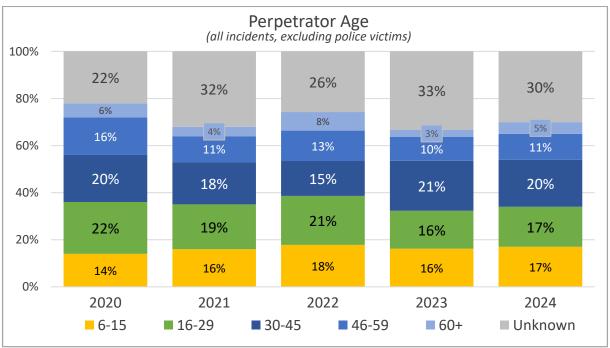




Age²

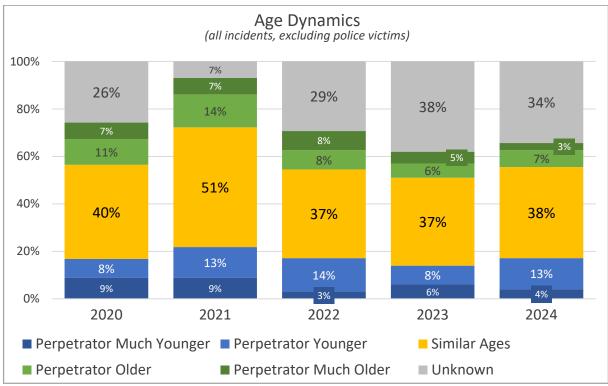
Excluding incidents targeting police, victims' and perpetrators' ages (where known) are shown below. Where both ages are known, victims and perpetrators were similar ages in more than half of incidents each year. In 22-24% of incidents each year, the perpetrator was younger than the victim, and in 16-24%, they were older. Nearly all incidents with victims under age 16 involved perpetrators in a similar age range, though a handful of children and young people were targeted each year by adults in their 30s to 70s, including several assaults.





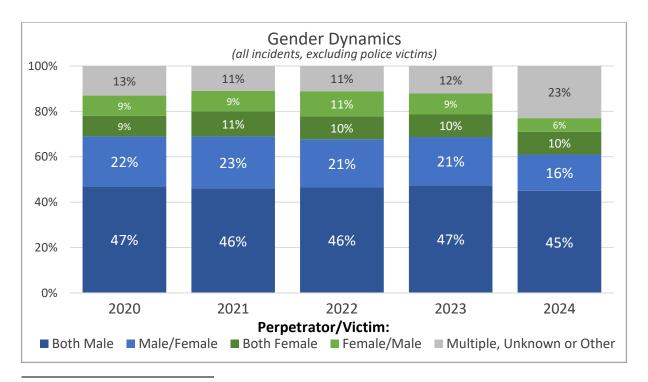
² Similar age: ten years apart or less (five years for under-16s). Older/younger: age gap of 11-24 years (6-14 years for under-16s). Much older/younger: age gap of 25 years or more (15 years or more for under-16s).





Gender³

Excluding police, where known and recorded, around one-third of victims each year were female and two-thirds were male. Over the five-year period, this included nine trans men or boys and 35 trans women or girls. Three victims were nonbinary. Meanwhile, more than three-quarters of individual perpetrators each year were male and less than one-quarter were female. Broadly speaking, the gender ratio of victims, perpetrators, and the dynamics between them (shown below) has been stable since 2015. Excluding incidents where the perpetrator's gender was unknown, around two-thirds of female victims were targeted by male perpetrators, and 15-20% vice-versa.



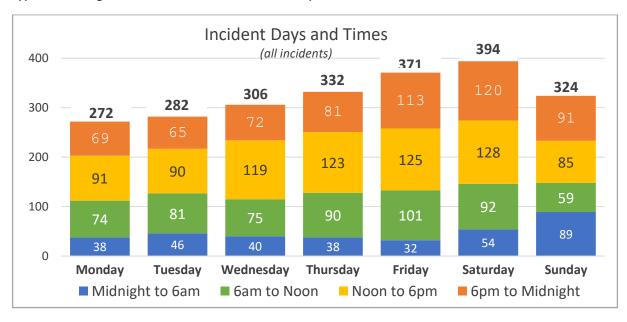
³ 'Multiple, Unknown or Other' includes incidents where the victim's or perpetrator's gender was not recorded, where one or both was a mixed-gender group, or where the victim was nonbinary.



Time and Place of Incidents

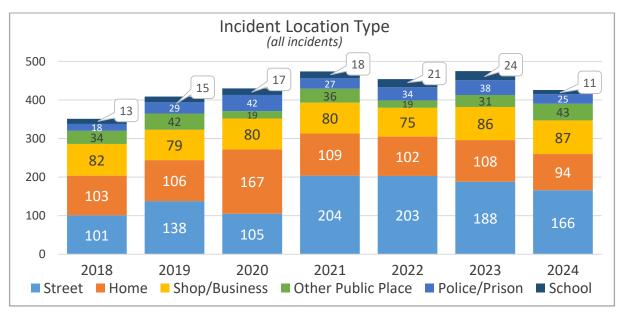
Incident Days and Times

As shown below, between 2020 and 2024, the days and times with the highest number of incidents were Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays between noon and 6pm (376 total), accounting for 16% of all incidents. A large proportion also took place in the evening hours of Friday and Saturday, between 6pm and midnight (233 total). This is not surprising, given that many incidents are concentrated around bars and nightclubs. However, while weekday overnights (midnight to 6am) were quieter, it is likely that the relatively higher number of incidents reported in the mornings (6am to noon) were due to typical working hours. Overall, there was no time period free from incidents.



Location Type

As shown below, the most frequent location type for incidents was on the street, apart from in 2020, when the early pandemic restricted people's movement. Otherwise, broadly speaking, the proportion of incidents in different location types has remained similar over time. Note that most online and social media related incidents are recorded as occurring in the victim's home. 'Shops/Businesses' include pubs and nightclubs, and 'Other Public Places' include public transport, sports centres, religious settings, hospitals, etc. Incident locations by postcode are shown in the next section.





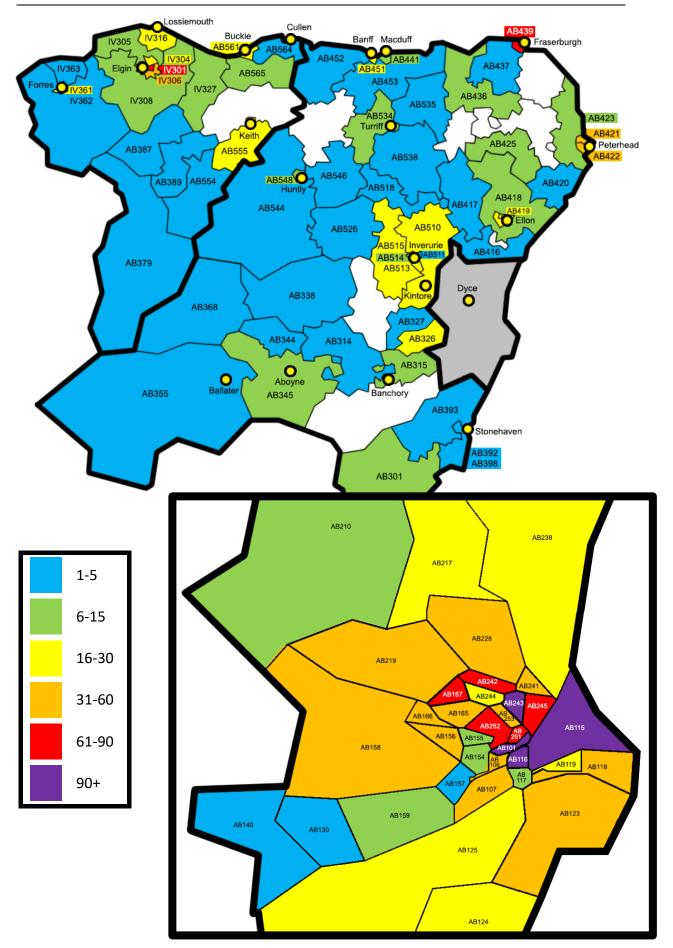
